## Ring Sizing Guide (US)

Use this guide with an existing ring to find out your ring size. For greatest accuracy, use it with a ring with a similar band size to the ring you wish to buy.

1. Print this document to $100 \%$. Make sure that in your print settings, page scaling is set to none. To make sure that you have printed correctly, use a ruler and measure the line below. It should measure 3 cm .

2. Match the inner edge of your ring to one of the circles in the ring size section below. The number that matches your ring is your ring size.

3. If your ring falls between two sizes, we recommend you choose the larger size.

4. A larger ring size is needed if you are sizing for a ring with a wide band. Bands approximately 5 mm wide or more generally require a slightly larger size for most people. We recommend that you use the cut out ring sizer below to measure your ring size. We also recommend that you measure your ring size during the day as our fingers expand when they are warm.

Cut out the ring sizer and wrap it around your finger with the numbers facing outwards. Slot the tip of the ring sizer into the slit opening. Adjust the sizer around your finger for a comfortble fit. The number that is aligned with the slit is your ring size. Important: A final check - make sure that the "ring" made by the ring sizer can be removed from your finger.
